2. 1020 W. Myrtle Street

A previous potential buyer has returned the house back to Paul Horvath, and there has been no work done on the structure and Mr. Horvath will not return calls or meet with the building inspector. Staff recommends condemning this house as dangerous and unsafe.

V. ITEMS FOR COMMISSION ACTION

- A. Consider a request for approval of the exact location for a statue of Remington at the northwest corner of Penn/Laurel.**

On November 14, 2019 the Commission authorized placement of a Remington statue near the 1916 City Hall building. On March 12, 2020, the Commission

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authorized the Remington statue location to be moved from 1916 City Hall to downtown on the northwest corner of Penn/Laurel with the exact location to be determined once the funds have been raised. The exact location has now been decided on and it is anticipated the statue will be installed in April. The cost of the statue, including installation will be funded from donations.

On the motion of Commissioner Hayse, seconded by Commissioner Caflisch the Commission authorized the placement of a Remington statue on the northwest corner of Penn/Laurel at the exact location as presented.

- B. Consider adopting a resolution declaring a financial emergency relating to anticipated high utility bills due to prolonged sub-zero wind chills.

Administrative staff met with the Montgomery County Emergency Manager and watched a live video from the League of Kansas Municipalities last Friday regarding the potential for higher rates than normal for natural gas and/or electricity. The League recommended adopting a resolution declaring a financial emergency. Montgomery County passed such a declaration on February 22, 2021 and City staff is recommending the City do this as well. Passage of Emergency Declarations could become important if aid becomes available.

- C. Consider awarding a demolition bid for 201 E. Main Street.

City of Independence received bids for the removal of 201 E. Main Street. The City received two bids with G&G Dozer, the low bid at \$43,200.00. It is staff recommendation to award the bid to G&G Dozer for the removal of the property.

Removal will be done in two phases. The building will be removed, leaving the slab and the City will work with the State to determine if there are any hazards before final removal of the slab and grading of the property.

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The demolition account balance was \$123,055.38 after the previous demolitions were awarded on February 11, 2021. The account balance would be \$79,855.38 with the completion of the 201 E. Main demolition.

James Beachner objected to the awarding of the bid because he feels that there were irregularities with G & G Dozer's bid.

On the motion of Commissioner Hayse, seconded by Commissioner Caflisch the Commission award G&G Dozer the demolition bid for 201 E. Main for a maximum of \$43,200.00, subject to approval by the State Historic Preservation office.

- D. Consider adopting a Charter Ordinance exempting the City from certain statutory provisions relating to Municipal Court; and an ordinance providing for substitute provisions for procedures in Municipal Court.

City staff has been working to improve our Code Enforcement and Building Department efforts. A recent addition to the Code Enforcement Team was Animal Control. The Code Enforcement Team is currently cross-training and working together to cover Animal Control and Code Enforcement duties. As a part of our cross-training efforts, Code Enforcement needs the ability to issue citations and court appearances. The ordinances would then allow the City Manager to appoint designated City Officers, who are not law enforcement certified, to issue citations for related ordinance violations.

These efforts are combined with on-going city efforts to streamline our court process. They allow citizens online access to view violations and pay online versus coming to court.
